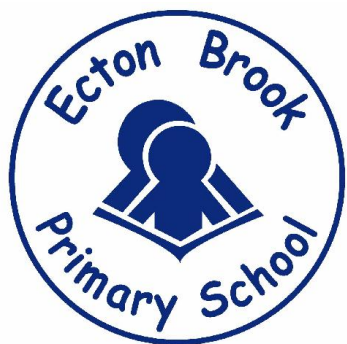

### Impact of the Sports Premium Grant Spending in 2015-2016

1. Increased confidence in teaching REALPE across the school so that the PE provision in the school to be at least good.
2. Family FUNS club introduced to create closer links with parents this has increased attendance at school.
3. Over 90% of Level 2 competitions across the town entered with a range of children taking part.
4. The outdoor provision improved with the inclusion of a tyre park and extension to the trim trails on both sites to ensure children are physically active at break and lunch times.
5. All children in year 5 to have received 18 swimming sessions to develop confidence and safety in water. Over 60% of children completed the sessions being able to swim at least 25m.
  
6. Opportunities for all KS2 children to take part in extra curriculum sporting clubs during the year. 89% of KS2 children have taken part in an extra curriculum club. Over 30 different sporting clubs on offer that were all free to the children.
7. Having a minibus has meant that many more children have been able to experience sporting opportunities throughout the year.

The school achieved the Gold Sports Kitemark again.

Our Sports Premium Funding is spent in a sustainable and inclusive way trying to develop both sports and PE teaching in school. The targets are developed to improve physical opportunities and challenge for all, aiming to embed an active and healthy lifestyle for our children.
